OPENING KEYNOTE

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

Lt. Mark Wynn

Lt. Wynn will motivate the audience to look at domestic violence through the eyes of a twenty-year public servant and a ten-year survivor of domestic violence. He will discuss the importance of an ongoing commitment to guaranteeing individual civil rights. During the opening keynote, he will address why victims are reluctant to report, why they stay, why offenders batter and the impact of violence on children. Attendees will further their understanding of victims’ lack of protection and loss of trust in government and the community, as well as who pays the price for failing the victims of this often hidden crime. He will draw a clear connection between power and control used in terrorism and in domestic violence and will challenge the audience to change the system to ensure the safety of victims, the police and the community.



ABOUT MARK: Lt. Mark Wynn is a 21-year member of the Nashville Metropolitan Police Department. He served as Lieutenant to the Domestic Violence Division and was a member of the Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) Team for 15 years. He is the recipient of numerous awards and certificates, including the 1995 National Improvement of Justice Award and the 1998 Nashvillian of the Year Award.

Olga Trujillo watched as her father abused her mother for years. She was also sexually abused by her father and brothers. Although tragic, her story of survival is inspiring and hopeful. She shows how each person can and does make a difference in the lives of others.



ABOUT OLGA: Olga Trujillo is an attorney, speaker, author and survivor. Her experience over the past 26 years has been as a private attorney, an attorney for the U.S. Department of Justice and a consultant to many local, state and national organizations. Olga is an internationally sought speaker and author of “The Sum of My Parts”.
